The Gospel of John week 13 Discussion Questions

Describe a time when someone you know (of course not you) tried to get away with something and the truth came out.

Read John 13:12-17. What has been your experience with foot washing? How has your experience compared to that of other sacraments (communion and baptism)? Foot washing is considered an important sacrament by some Christians, and completely ignored by others. Why do you think that is?

Read John 13:31-36. For twelve chapters Jesus has been saying over and over “my time has not yet come”. Here He clearly says the time has come. What do you think the disciples are feeling at this moment? Explain.

Look back over both of these passages. Both passages give practical instructions on how to live as a Jesus follower. What are they? Are they connected to each other or separate? Explain. Do they look different depending on how far you are in your faith journey? Why or why not?

“There is a difference between serving somewhere and having a lifestyle of service.” Do you agree or disagree with this statement? Explain. How good are you doing at living out these commands? Are you serving in a ministry inside the church? Are you serving in a ministry outside the church? How can you improve?
