### Week 3: John 20

#### John 20:1-10

The physical resurrection of Jesus is the \_\_\_\_\_ of our faith.

John 20:2 (NLT) She ran and found Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved. She said, “They have taken the Lord’s body out of the tomb, and we don’t know where they have put him!”

John 20:9-10 (NLT) ...for until then they still hadn’t understood the Scriptures that said Jesus must rise from the dead. Then they went home.

#### John 20:11-18

John 20:17 (NLT) “Don’t cling to me,” Jesus said, “for I haven’t yet ascended to the Father. But go find my brothers and tell them, ‘I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.’”

John 1:12-13 (NLT) But to all who believed him and accepted him, he gave the right to become children of God. They are reborn—not with a physical birth resulting from human passion or plan, but a birth that comes from God.

#### John 20:19-23

John 20:22 (NLT) Then he breathed on them and said, “Receive the Holy Spirit.”

#### John 20:24-29

John 20:29 (NLT) Then Jesus told him, “You believe because you have seen me. Blessed are those who believe without seeing me.”

Hebrews 11:1 (NLT) Faith is the confidence that what we hope for will actually happen; it gives us assurance about things we cannot see.

Ephesians 2:8-9 (NLT) God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can’t take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it.

1 Peter 1:8-9 (NLT) You love him even though you have never seen him. Though you do not see him now, you trust him; and you rejoice with a glorious, inexpressible joy. The reward for trusting him will be the salvation of your souls.

John 20:30-31 (NLT) The disciples saw Jesus do many other miraculous signs in addition to the ones recorded in this book. But these are written so that you may continue to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing in him you will have life by the power of his name.

Final Thought: John gives us an insider perspective of Jesus based on what they \_\_\_\_\_, so we can \_\_\_\_\_ without seeing. Do you have faith in Jesus? Are you living through that faith every day?

### His Time Has Come week 3 Discussion Questions:

We have reached the end of John's gospel. Other than one final lesson with Peter, the story of the Messiah is done. Go back and read John 1:1-18. What do you see in these verses after studying through the entire gospel? How has your perspective changed? Explain.

Read John 20:17. "After the cross, we are all God's children; brothers and sister of Jesus." This is a big shift in the story of the Messiah and the gospel of grace. This is a concept that is seen all over the New Testament. Examine the following verses. (John 1:12-13, Romans 8:29, Galatians 3:23-29, 2 Corinthians 5:17, Philippians 2:14-15) What are the implications for us in our daily journey as Jesus followers? Explain.

Faith is a big part of the gospel of grace. Review John 20:29, Hebrews 11:1, Ephesian 2:8-9, and 1 Peter 1:8-9. Based on these verses, define faith in your own words. How strong do you feel your faith currently is? Explain. What is in your life that challenges your faith the most right now? What do you need to get to the point that this will no longer hinder your faith journey?
