### Week 2: John 19

John 10:17-18 (NLT) “The Father loves me because I sacrifice my life so I may take it back again. No one can take my life from me. I sacrifice it voluntarily. For I have the authority to lay it down when I want to and also to take it up again. For this is what my Father has commanded.”

### John 19:1-16

John 19:1-3 (NLT) Then Pilate had Jesus flogged with a lead-tipped whip. The soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they put a purple robe on him. “Hail! King of the Jews!” they mocked, as they slapped him across the face.

Flogging Jesus was a \_\_\_\_\_ by Pilate to answer “what is truth?”

John 19:11 (NLT) Then Jesus said, “You would have no power over me at all unless it were given to you from above. So the one who handed me over to you has the greater sin.”

Jesus continues to live out the \_\_\_\_\_ before the cross; even to Pilate.

John 16:9-10 (NLT) The world’s sin is that it refuses to believe in me. Righteousness is available because I go to the Father, and you will see me no more.

### John 16-37

John 19:16-18 (NLT) Then Pilate turned Jesus over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus away. Carrying the cross by himself, he went to the place called Place of the Skull (in Hebrew, Golgotha). There they nailed him to the cross. Two others were crucified with him, one on either side, with Jesus between them

## Death on a cross was Roman

---

John 19:33 (NLT) But when they came to Jesus, they saw that he was already dead, so they didn’t break his legs.

When crucified on a cross, \_\_\_\_\_ is the actual cause of death.

John 19:34-37 (NLT) One of the soldiers, however, pierced his side with a spear, and immediately blood and water flowed out. (This report is from an eyewitness giving an accurate account. He speaks the truth so that you also may continue to believe.) These things happened in fulfillment of the Scriptures that say, “Not one of his bones will be broken,” and “They will look on the one they pierced.”

Jesus didn’t die of natural causes; He died of a \_\_\_\_\_.

### John 18:38-42

### His Time Has Come Week 2 Discussion Questions

The crucifixion story is very familiar, even to those who don’t follow Jesus. How are you able to see it with “fresh eyes” this week? Was there anything

about the crucifixion that you hadn't heard before? What was surprising?  
What detail has the biggest impact on your faith journey?

Throughout the gospel, John has been foreshadowing the crucifixion.  
Examine the following passages from earlier in the gospel. John 3:13-15,  
7:39, 8:28-29, 12:23, 12:30-33, 13:31-32, 16:20, 17:1-5. Do these verses  
change your view and/or interpretation of the crucifixion? Why or why not?

Read John 19:11. This statement by Jesus is the key to the entire trial. Some  
scholars believe that this statement of Jesus reveals that "The Jews" and  
Pilate were the ones who were really on trial, not Jesus. Do you agree or  
disagree with this viewpoint? Explain. Read Romans 13:1-7. How does this  
passage from Paul correlate with Jesus' statement in 19:11? What  
implications does it make for us as Jesus followers in 2016?
